We want to thank you for all your support, whether that be through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to the success our school and the programs we can offer. Within our school your support in 2025 has allowed us to:

- Offer Mandarin classes and special curriculum experiences for our students across all year levels
- Heavily subsidise excursions, incursions and camps for all students

**Sibling discount**

- 10% for the 2<sup>nd</sup> child; and
- 25% for the 3<sup>rd</sup> child and any subsequent siblings.

These discounts will be automatically applied on Compass for all who qualify.

### Financial Support for Families

James Cook Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- State Schools' Relief* provides financial support for eligible families to purchase clothing/uniforms at a reduced rate
- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund* provides payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions
- Payment plans for Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

## Payment methods

Parent contributions towards the requested payments are essential to maintain the high quality of education that we provide at James Cook Primary School. Payment can be made electronically via Compass. Please contact the school if you need help logging in to Compass

Alternatively, cash and EFTpos payments can be made directly at the James Cook Primary School Office.

## Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information

## PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY OVERVIEW



### FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



### PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

#### Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

#### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

#### Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



### SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
