We are finally seeing some obvious progress with the roof replacement works. Whilst there have been many tons of dirt being dug and deep holes being made, it has been hard to see the actual progress visually. Now the new hall roof is actually taking shape, and it will be higher than before to ensure that water runs off to the stormwater drains, not inside the hall and the storerooms.

The crane has been the eye-catcher this past week and the cause of a great deal of fascination among the children and the staff. I had an update meeting with the VSBA, and the builders earlier this week and we are hoping that we will have the Hall and the Library Building back in action for the beginning of Term 4 − Fingers crossed. ✓ Once that happens the new building project can commence.



Over the next few weeks, we will be moving the office up to Module 4. We are gradually setting up and will be ready for the relocation prior to the next phase of building works. Access will via the cyclone wire gate up from the Adventure Playground next to the kindergarten. By next term, the front gate access on James Cook Drive, will no longer be available. All students will be required to enter the school via one of the 3 back gates behind Modules 2, 3, 4.




