
Principal News




Module 2



Last term we created clay pinch pots and clay animal sculptures. We have finally finished these, with glossy coloured paint.

To complete the Scarecrow paintings, we only used the three primary colours; red yellow and blue. Mixing these colours together, we created a whole range of different colours.



The paper mache masks are taking shape with the layering work completed, giving a hard sculptural shell. Eye holes have been cut and the fun part of adding details and paintwork is well underway


